The Australian wildflower paintings of Fiveash and Rowan come together for the first time in this landmark exhibition exploring South Australia's rich botanical collections. Challenging Victorian conventions, Ellis Rowan travelled widely and enjoyed international acclaim for her wildflower paintings, and the work of Rosa Fiveash attracted the interest of Australia's leading botanists.

BEST IN SHOW 2025

Australian Photographic Dog Prize



David Roche Gallery is excited to announce the inaugural *Best in Show 2025: Australian Photographic Dog Prize*. This biannual prize pays homage to the legacy of our founder, David Roche AM (1930-2013), and celebrates the many ways in which dogs play a central role in our lives.

Best in Show 2025: Australian Photographic Dog Prize is now open to amateur and professional photographers with a first prize of \$5000. The Young photographer category offers a first prize of \$500 and the People's Choice Award \$500. Four competition categories are open for entries: Dog Portrait; Dogs and Companions; Dogs in Action; and Puppies.

Co-judges of *Best in Show 2025* are Robert Reason, Director of David Roche Gallery and internationally renowned animal photographer Alex Cearns OAM. Competition entries close at 5pm, Monday 19 May 2025, and shortlisted photographs will be exhibited at David Roche Gallery, 30 August – 25 October 2025.

TODAY'S TREASURE



Sèvres Porcelain Manufactory Six botanical plates 1838–40

Alongside our current exhibition *Nature Revealed: Rosa Fiveash & Ellis Rowan*, David Roche's *Gilded aviary* is installed with six plates produced at the Sèvres Porcelain Manufactory painted with botanical specimens. The plates were originally part of a grand, 100-piece dinner service presented by Louis-Philippe, King of France to politician Narcisse-Achille, comte de Salvandy.

The service included baskets, sauce tureens, footed serving dishes, and many plates, each decorated with botanical specimens, the names of which are inscribed on the reverse. A handsome border completed each piece, comprising a gilt trellis pattern over a bleu agate ground. This colour was preferred by Louis-Philippe, who ordered extensive fond bleu agate dinner services for the Châteaux de Saint-Cloud and de Compiègne in the early 1830s, and continued to use the colour for several presentation dinner and dessert services.

The comte de Salvandy received his dinner service on 28 October 1842, and was valued at 6,316 livres, or over \$40,000 today. In 1986, 60 plates were sold from the service and over the following years smaller groups and single pieces came onto the market. David Roche purchased his examples at auction in 2011, and displayed them in the red hallway in Fermoy House.

The plates depict fire heath and wax heath (*Erica cerinthoides*, *Erica ventricosa*); snake's head fritillary and soldier boys (*Fritillaria meleagris*, *Lachenalia pendula*); phlox spp.; cup-and-saucer vine (*Cobæa Scandens*); anemone and sweet pea (*Anemone coronaria*, *Lathyrus odoratus*); geranium and meadow cranesbill (*Pelargonium ardens*, *Plenum violaceum*). The artists were Pierre Huard, Pierre Jean Victor Amable Langle, Madame Charles (née Huard), and Joséphine des Isnards.



TREASURES ON TOUR



Bittersweet: Chocolate, Tea, Coffee Hamilton Gallery

David Roche Gallery is proud to lend fine eighteenth century porcelain made at the Meissen and Sèvres manufactories, an important zoological tea and coffee service attributed to Marc Schoelcher's Paris manufactory, and John Russell's oil portrait of Ensign and Lieutenant (later General Sir) James Duff to Hamilton Gallery, Victoria, for their intriguing new exhibition *Bittersweet: Chocolate, Tea, Coffee*.

Curated in collaboration with the University of Melbourne lecturer, Dr. Matthew J. Martin, *Bittersweet* traces the global journey of these beloved beverages, uncovering the rich and complex histories that saw these ingredients transform from exotic commodities to everyday indulgences. The exhibition also highlights the cultural significance of these beverages over the centuries, and their darker histories tied to colonialism, slavery, and environmental impact. Featuring

intricate tea sets, ornate silverware, unique vessels, paintings and prints, the exhibition sparks an enduring question: how much did, and does, a cup of coffee, tea, or chocolate really cost?

Bittersweet is on display at Hamilton Gallery, Victoria until 4 May 2025. A publication to complement the exhibition themes is in development.
